Mary Cozette Beene Vaught died peacefully March 2, 2020, with family by her side after losing her battle with leukemia.

Cozette was a 1963 graduate of the University of Arkansas where she earned a Bachelor of Science in Education and was a member of the Alpha Chi Omega sorority.

Cozette was a proud resident of Wynne. She was a teacher for 30 years with 26 of those years in the Wynne Public School System. She was an active member of the Wynne Presbyterian Church where she was a Sunday school teacher and served as a deacon and elder. Cozette was also an active member of P.E.O. Chapter CP and was an early member of the Cross County Arts Council.

Cozy never met a stranger. She enjoyed hosting countless friends and family in her home and at the family farm known as Plumnelly. She especially loved the many years of laughter, tears, and travel with her coffee group. She also attended many Gulf Park reunions where she met many alumni and rekindled old acquaintances.

Cozy was a devoted mother, grandmother, sister, and aunt. Coco spent countless hours on the golf course with William and Robbie. She took them to tournaments all over the state and was well known by many of the junior golfers and their families. Coco also loved spending time with her only granddaughter, Hallie, by taking her to lunch and going shopping.
