



Allen 'Gus' Colvin

Mr. Allen A. 'Gus' Colvin, age 98, of Forrest City, died Monday at the Forrest City Medical Center in Forrest City. He had been in poor health for the past three months.

Mr. Colvin was born January 1, 1915, in Hamilton, Alabama, and was the son of John Wesley Colvin and Georgia Ann Palmer Colvin. He lived in St. Francis County most all of his life, was a mechanic, and attended the House Ministries in Forrest City.
