Dr. David Dwight Mulligan, age 64, of Covington, Virginia, died December 19, 2007, after a long illness in Richmond, Virginia.

Dave, as he was known to most, was born August 30, 1943, in Jacksonville, Florida, a son of the late William J. 'Bill' Mulligan and Mary Zalesney Mulligan.

Dave is survived by his wife, Lynn Hobbs Mulligan, formerly of Marianna, three sons; Christopher Jason 'C.J.' He was a member of TAPPI, a pulp and paper organization and taught Sunday School from an early age. His most favorite book was The Bible and there was never a time that he did not share his love and trust in The Lord with everyone he met.
