Freddie Harold Brown, 86, a resident of Colt, Arkansas, was called home March 21st in Alta Loma, California. The son of Buster (Jake) Brown and Eunice Brown (Rice) of Caldwell.

Freddie was born in Caldwell, Arkansas and a graduate of Wynne High School. He joined the Air Force in June of 1959, where he served honorably for 4 years as an Aircraft Mechanic, with a rank of Airman First Class. While stationed in England, Freddie courted and married Teresa Mary Pauline Brown (Dew). Together they raised four children in Glendora, California, Sharon Brown (Moody), Kelly Brown (Ellis), Stephen Brown, and Mary Brown (Toscano). After leaving the Air Force, Freddie and Pauline lived in Caldwell for a short time, but then moved to Pasadena, California so he could be closer to the aircraft industry for job opportunities. Freddie and Pauline lived in a small apartment during this time raising their daughter Sharon. To support his family, Freddie began working as a body and fender repair man on automobiles. But another child would soon be on the way, so they decided to look for a house in the Foothill community of Glendora. It was here Freddie and Pauline raised their four children until Pauline's death in 2001. In 2007 Freddie moved to Colt, Arkansas to help care for his mom Eunice Brown and later married Rose Young. Freddie was a member of Caldwell Baptist Church, and he loved to scuba dive, fish, and was a licensed ham radio operator (call sign WB6SOD).

Freddie loved and cherished his family and is known for his reply, “I love you more” when you told him you loved him and “Lord willing and the creek don’t rise” when departing till a later time. Freddie is survived by his wife, Rose Young, his two sisters Patricia Smith of Caldwell and Nancy Herbert of Forrest City, his four children, ten grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.
