Mrs. Fannie Jean Camp Pope age 94, died in Virginia on Thursday, January 18, 2024. She was a long time resident of Forrest City, Arkansas.

Mrs. Pope was born August 10, 1929 in Calvert, Grant County Arkansas. She was the daughter of Louis T. Camp and Daisy Stringer Camp. They lived at the Crossroad Community 6 miles South of Sheridan, Arkansas.
