Mr. Kenneth Darrell Lee, age 72, of Colt, formerly of Forrest City, died Monday at his home in Colt.

Mr. Lee was born January 2, 1938, in Harrison, Arkansas, and was the son of James Cleo Lee and Vera Ray Lee. He lived in St. Francis County all of his life, was a Veteran of the National Guard, was retired from Yale Industries, had served on the Forrest City City Council from 1981 until 1990, and was a member of the First Baptist Church of Caldwell.

Mr. Lee married Wynema Harwell in 1961, and she preceded him in death in 2005. He is survived by one son, Kerry Mitchell Lee, and wife, Lisa, of Wynne, one grandson, Ryan Lee of Wynne, and three sisters; Bonnie Ann Jumper of West Helena, Jackie Sue Brown of Olive Branch, Mississippi, and Betty Tolman of Boston, Massachusetts.
