



## Mamie Chauvin

August 30, 1929 - May 16, 2010

Mrs. Mamie Jo Chauvin, age 80, of Forrest City, died Sunday at the Methodist Hospital in Memphis.

Mrs. Chauvin was born August 30, 1929, in New Orleans, Louisiana, and was the daughter of Joseph DiMarco and Laura Macaluso DiMarco. She was a retired teacher from the Forrest City Public Schools, was a travel agent, was a member of the V.F.W. Auxillary, the Altar Society of the St. Francis Catholic Church, the Arkansas Retired Teachers Association, and was a member of the St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church.

Mrs. Chauvin married Junior Ed Chauvin, in 1950, and he survives her along with one daughter, Nannette Goff of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, one son, Dr. E. J. Chauvin, of Conway, one brother, Dr. Russell DiMarco of New Orleans, and three grandchildren; Justin R. Goff, Jody Chauvin, and Aymee Chauvin.
