



## Sallie Dudley Bridgforth

December 22, 1916 - August 10, 2013

Mrs. Sallie Pearl Dudley Bridgforth of Forrest City, Arkansas, died at her home on Saturday, August 10, 2013.

Mrs. Bridgforth was born December 22, 1916, in DeWitt, Arkansas. She was the daughter of Roger White Dudley and Clara Barnett Dudley. Mrs. Bridgforth attended Christian College in Columbia, Missouri, where she was a member of Phi Theta Kappa honorary society. She graduated from the University of Arkansas where she was a member of Pi Beta Phi sorority. She was a charter member of the Forrest City Junior Auxiliary, a charter member of Chapter BF of the P. E. O. Sisterhood and served many years on the Forrest City Library Board. Mrs. Bridgforth was a member of the Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd where she served on the Altar Guild.

Mrs. Bridgforth was preceded in death by her husband Jack Bridgforth of 72 years.
