He was so proud of his prize-winning Beefmaster cattle and hated to give them up when he became unable to care for them.

No one could have loved his family more. The void left by the death of son, Glenn, in 1980, was filled with son Mike's four children and eight grandchildren; great nieces and nephew, and three godchildren. Red cherished the time spent with them all. Affectionately called Poppy and Uncle Red, their bond with him was extremely strong and beautiful to behold.

Red never met a stranger and talking with people was a passion. He loved it. His joy was to seek out people with a need and help them incognito. To this day, only those people and God know who they are. Travel was another passion. Red and Viola, his wife of 64 years, were blessed to be able to travel extensively throughout Mexico, the U.S., Canada and Alaska in their motorhome. He never missed an opportunity to meet and talk to people.
